Historical Records Relevant to the "**MARQUIS of ANGLESEA**"

Disembarkation Return of the Detachment Undermentioned, Dated Perth 24 August 1829:

Detachment: 63rd Regt.

From What Station: Chatham, England

On Board What Ship: Marquis of Anglesea

- 1 Sergeant
- 9 Privates
- 4 Women
- 2 Children

Remarks: One child born on Board on the 12 August 1829. *Battye Library Acc 36 Vol/159*

From Dr Alexander Collie's Journal:

"September 7, 1829. During a gale from the westward on the night of September 3, the ship **Marquis of Anglesea**

(352 tons) which had lately arrived (on August 23rd under the command of Captain W Stewart) with 130 settlers on board and anchored in Gage Roads close to the mouth of the Swan River, drove on shore, bilged and filled with water; all hands were saved with part of the cargo that remained unloaded. This with the previous driving of the **Calista** shows that Gage Roads, at this season is not safe and may occasion the establishment of another sea-port in Cockburn Sound."

From a Letter by Captain W.T.Dance of HMS Sulphur dated 9th September 1829:

"The **Marquis of Anglesea**

drove with three anchors ahead in a gale of wind and going onto the rocks southward of the entrance of the river, was bilged and I fear, can never be got off.
